# THE AWAKENING

## **31 Rare Birds Protected Under U.S. Law**

## Funds Found to Conserve Migratory Birds Along

SAN FRANCISCO, California, June 16, 2009, ENS) - The nonprofit Center for Biological Diversity reached a legal settlement with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Monday that requires the agency to provide protection for dozens of the world's most imperiled bird species and come into compliance with the Endangered Species Act.

The Service has committed to publishing final-listing determinations for six species of foreign birds and proposed listings for an additional 25 species, in accordance with a negotiated timeline that terminates on December 29, 2009.

Alarmed about declines of scores of the world's rarest and most beautiful birds, ornithologists submitted petitions to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in 1980 and 1991 to list 73 bird species from around the world under the Endangered Species Act.

But in violation of the Endangered Species Act, the agency has spent the better part of two decades making recycled petition findings that these species continue to warrant listing but that their listing is precluded due to higher-priority listings.

The Service has listed only six of the bird species and published proposed listing rules for 11 others. At least five of the 73 birds have gone extinct while waiting for protection.

Any progress that has been made toward protecting these species has been the result of lawsuits brought by the Center for Biological Diversity, negotiations and court findings that if

the Service continues at such a pace, "many of the species in question may very well be extinct by the time they are found to warrant a listing."

So the Center again notified the Fish and Wildlife Service of its intention to file suit for violations of the Endangered Species Act and as a result of that notice reached a settlement with the agency to bring it into compliance with the Act.

"We are encouraged that the new administration is showing signs of clearing up its foreign listing program backlog and finally accepting its duty to list these extremely rare birds under the Endangered Species Act," said Center International Program staffer Jacki Lopez.

"Listing foreign species under the Act is an important step in spurring increased inter-

national recognition of those species' urgent plights," she said.

When foreign species are listed under the Endangered Species Act the President is authorized to provide financial assistance for the development and management of programs in foreign countries.

The Fish and Wildlife Service is authorized to encourage conservation programs for foreign endangered species and provide personnel and training for these programs.

Listing international species restricts trade in vanishing species, increases conservation funding and attention to recovery efforts and adds scrutiny to projects proposed by the U.S. government and multilateral lending agencies.

## the Americas' Flyway

WASHINGTON, D.C., June 16, 2009 (ENS) The work of BirdLife International partner organizations throughout the Americas is advancing due to \$4.8 million in U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service grants for 36 neotropical migratory bird conservation projects first announced on May 13, International Migratory Bird Day.

Now, companies, institutions and individuals have contributed an additional \$18 million in matching funds to support habitat restoration, environmental education, population monitoring and other priority activities in the United States, Puerto Rico, Canada, Mexico and 12 Latin American and Caribbean countries.

"This is brilliant news for neotropical birds and Important Birds Areas (IBAs). The Partnership's great work on migratory species will reap the benefit from these grants," said Dr. Rob Clay, senior conservation manager for BirdLife in the Americas.

Of the world's 10,000 or so species of birds, around 4,500 are found in the Americas with many discovered each year. Most of the Americas' bird species are found in the tropics but bird species have adapted to the driest deserts, highest sierras and the freezing weather at the southern tip of South America.

One of the 36 projects is supported with a \$90,200 grant with matching funds of \$271,000 from BirdLife partners and Kennecott Utah Copper Corporation-Rio Tinto.

This funding will enable BirdLife International and partner Aves Argentinas to assess the role of Important Bird Areas in Argentina and Chile in conserving neotropical migrants.

The project seeks to advance the conservation of four high-priority sites in Argentina, Chile and Peru that are linked through shared migratory species of conservation concern to Great Salt Lake, Utah.

Kennecott Utah operates the world's largest open-pit copper mine in Bingham Canyon and the company is making an effort to counteract environmental degradation, including groundwater contamination in the aquifer downgradient of the Bingham Canyon mine.

The approach of linking the communities at the

Important Bird Areas with each other and with the community of Great Salt Lake has proved successful in Canada and Mexico, says Clay.

Great Salt Lake supports between two and five million shorebirds, as many as 1.7 million eared grebes and hundreds of thousands of waterfowl during spring and fall migrations. Because of its importance to migratory birds, the lake was designated a part of the Western Hemisphere Shorebird Reserve Network in 1992. The lake and its marshes provide a resting and staging area for the birds, as well as an abundance of brine shrimp and brine flies that serve as food.

Work by BirdLife partners SalvaNatura in El

## **Endgame by Derrick Jensen**

Hailed as the "Philosopher Poet" of the ecological movement, Derrick Jensen passionately explains how our industrial civilization and the persistent and widespread violence it requires, cannot last. He weaves history, philosophy, psychology, environmentalism, economics and literature into an intricate pattern of truth and resistance. The 2006 Press Action Award called Jensen's two-volume <u>Endgame</u> "the best work of nonfiction in 2006. <u>Endgame</u> is the most important book of the decade and could stand as the must-read book of our lifetimes."

**¬**o keep dogmatic pac-I ifists from calling the cops and then holding me till they arrive, I need to say that I no more advocate violence than I advocate nonviolence. Further, I think that when our lifestyle is predicated on the violent theft of resources, to advocate nonviolence without advocating the immediate dismantling of the entire system is not, in fact, to advocate nonviolence at all, but to tacitly countenance the violence (unseen by us, of course: see Premise Four in Endgame) on which the system is based. I advocate speaking honestly about violence (and other things) and I advocate paying attention to circumstances.

I advocate not allowing dogma to predetermine my course of action. I advocate keeping an open mind. I advocate a rigorous examination of all possibilities, including fair trade, "Reality Tours," lawsuits, writing, civil disobedience, vandalism, sabotage, violence and even voting. (Recently I was talking to a number of college students about the fix we're in and said, "We need to stop civilization from killing the planet by any means necessary." An instructor at the college, a longtime pacifist, corrected me, "You mean by any nonviolent means, of course." I replied that I meant precisely what I said.)

I advocate listening to my body. I advocate clean water and clean air. I advocate a world with wild salmon in it, and grizzlies, and sharks, whales (just yesterday I read - not in the capitalist press, obviously — that the federal government recently refused to provide protection for the North Pacific right whale, the world's most imperiled large whale, because, in the words of an industry spokesperson — oh, sorry, a government spokesperson -"the essential biological requirements of the population . . . are not sufficiently understood"), red-legged frogs, and Siskiyou Mountain salamanders. (Then tonight I read — also not in the capitalist press, silly: what do you think their purpose is, to provide useful information? — "The rare Siskiyou Mountain salamander may be facing extinction because the Bureau of Land Management will soon allow Boise Cascade to begin logging in the amphibian's [last remain-

ing] habitat.") I advocate a world in which human and nonhuman communities are allowed to live on their own landbases. I advocate not allowing those in power to take resources by force, by law, by convention or any other real or imagined means. Beyond not allowing, I advocate actively stopping them from doing so.

# Derrick Jensen Enthralls People at Maggie's Organics Farm Festival

ARMBURST, Pennsylvania, June 20, 2009 — On a spectacular windy, sunny, rainy, hot and then cool June day, nature cycled through all the elements as a backdrop to the activities at Maggie's Organics annual Farm Festival. Derrick Jensen's Saturday afternoon presentation at the Raspberry Building main stage was a highlight of the day. Approximately 70 people interacted with Jensen for more than two hours as he discussed his book Endgame and his other writings and responded to questions from the audience. One of the main points

One of the main points that I came away with was, 'The role of an activist is NOT to navigate systems of oppressive power with as much integrity as possible . . . . The role of an activist is to confront and take down systems of oppressive power.'

Other meaningful concepts discussed in depth by Jensen included 'no culture that uses resources is sustainable . . . there must always be reciprocity and replacement in order to maintain balance' and 'violence occurs when we extract any resources from the Earth, including tilling fields



to plant food . . . the plants, creatures, bacteria, fungi, root systems, insects and minerals in the soil are violently destroyed when we till a field for planting.' I had never thought of things quite this way before. I noticed at Maggie's farm, the wellmaintained fields were not tilled but had been carefully planted in rows, each individual plant poking through the strip of black material laid down to reduce the weeds just around the plants. In between the rows, the ground cover and 'weeds' continued to grow as nature intended. From my observations and new understandings, I was moved to write the poem, "The Last Drop of Oil," to the right. Maggie's Organics interactive farm is on top of a knoll with panoramic views of the surrounding mountain ridges where you may pick your own organic fruits and vegetables and picnic or the patio. The farm focuses on the most exotic heirloom varieties of produce and supplies a large commercial distributor as well as Maggie's on-site farm store and two restaurants.

Maggie's Mercantile restaurants, offering the best organic, vegan and raw foods, are located in Pittsburgh and in Stahlstown. I have eaten at the Stahlstown location, a few miles from Exit 91 of the Pensylvania Turnpike (Donegal). In the meat-and-potatoes culture that is much of western *Continued on page 10*

# The Uprising in the Amazon is More Urgent than Iran's It Will Determine the Future of the Planet

In the depths of the Amazon rainforest, the poorest people in the world have taken on the richest people in the world.

JohannHari.com, June 24, 2009 — While the world nervously watches the uprising in Iran, an even more important uprising has been passing unnoticed — yet its outcome will shape your fate and mine.

In the depths of the Amazon rainforest, the poorest people in the world have taken on the richest people in the world to defend a part of the ecosystem none of us can live without. They had nothing but wooden spears and moral force to defeat the oil companies — and, for today, they have won.

Here's the story of how it happened — and how we all need to pick up this fight.

Earlier this year, Peru's President, Alan Garcia, sold the rights to explore, log and drill 70 percent of his country's swathe of the Amazon to a slew of international oil companies. Garcia seems to see rainforest as a waste of good resources, saying of the Amazon's trees: "There are millions of hectares of timber there lying idle."

There was only one pesky flaw in Garcia's plan: the indigenous people who live in the Amazon. They are among the first peoples of the Americas subject to wave after wave of genocide since the arrival of the Conquistadors. They are weak. They have no guns, They barely have electricity. The government didn't bother to consult with them: What are a bunch of Indians going to do anyway? But the indigenous people have seen what has happened elsewhere in the Amazon when the oil companies arrive. Occidental Petroleum is currently facing charges in U.S. courts for dumping an estimated nine billion barrels of toxic waste in the regions of the Amazon where they operated from 1972 to 2000. Andres Sàndi Mucushua, the spiritual leader of the area known to the oil companies as Block 1AB, said in 2007: "My people are sick and dying because of Oxy. The water in our streams is not fit to drink and we can no longer eat the fish in our rivers or the animals in our forests." The company denies liability, saying they are "aware of no credible data of negative community health impacts." In the Ecuadorian Amazon, according to an independent report, toxic waste allegedly dumped after Chevron-Texaco's drilling has been blamed by an independent scientific investigation for 1,401 deaths, mostly of children from cancer. When BBC investigator Greg Palast put these charges to Chevron's lawyer, he replied: "And it's the only case of cancer in the world? How many cases of children with cancer do you have in the States? . . . They have to prove it's our crude, [which] is absolutely impossible." The people of the Amazon do not want to see their forests felled and their lands poisoned. And here, the need of the indigenous peoples to preserve their habitat has collided with your need to preserve your habitat. The rainforests inhale massive amounts of warming gases and keep them stored away from the atmosphere. Already, we are

chopping them down so fast that it is causing the accumulation of 25 percent more manmade carbon emissions every year — more than planes, trains and automobiles combined. But it is doubly destructive to cut rainforests down to get to fossil fuels, which then cook the planet yet more. Garcia's plan was to turn the Amazon from the planet's air conditioner into its fireplace.

Why is he doing this? He was responding to intense pressure from the U.S., whose new Free Trade Pact requires this "opening up" and pays for it from the International Monetary Fund using our taxes. In Peru, it has also been alleged that the ruling party, APRA, is motivated by oilbribes. Some of Garcia's associates have been the Amazon to their cronies.

The head of the parliamentary committee investigating the affair, Rep. Danile Abugattas, says: "The government has been giving away our natural resources to the lowest bidders. This has benefitted not Peru, but the administration's friends."

#### Indigenous People Fight Back

So the indigenous peoples acted in their own self-defense, and ours. Using their own bodies and weapons made from wood, they blockaded the rivers and roads to stop the oil companies from getting anything in or out. They captured two valves of Peru's sole pipeline between the country's gas field and the coast, which could have led to fuel rationing. Their leaders issued a statement explaining: "We will fight together with our parents and children to take care of the forest, to save the life of the Equator and the entire world." Garcia responded by sending in the military. He declared a "state of emergency" in the Amazon, suspending almost all constitutional rights. Army helicopters opened fire on the protesters with live ammunition and stungrenades. Thirty-four protesters were killed but the indigenous peoples did not run away. Even though they were risking their lives, they stood their ground. One of their leaders, Davi Yanomami, said simply: "The Earth has no price. It cannot be bought or sold or exchanged. It is very important that white people, black people and indigenous peoples fight together to save the life of the forest and the Earth. If we don't fight together what will our future be?"

#### Victory!

And then something extraordinary happened. The indigenous peoples won. The Peruvian Congress repealed the laws that allowed oil company drilling by a margin of 82 votes to 12. Garcia was forced to apologize for his "serious errors and exaggerations." The protesters have celebrated and returned to their homes deep in the Amazon.

Of course, the oil companies will regroup and return — but this is an inspirational victory for the forces of sanity that will be hard to reverse.

Human beings need to make far more decisions like this: to leave fossil fuels in the ground and to leave rainforests standing. In microcosm, this rumble in the jungle is the fight we all face now. Will we allow a small number of rich people to make a short-term profit from seizing

and burning resources at the expense of our collective ability to survive?

If this sounds like hyperbole, listen to Professor Jim Hansen, the worlds' leading climatologist, whose predictions have consistently turned out to be correct. He says: "Clearly, if we burn all fossil fuels, we will destroy the planet we know." We would set the planet on a course to an icefree state with a sea level 75 meters (246 feet) higher. Coastal disasters would occur continually. The only uncertainty is the time it would take for complete ice sheet disintegration."

#### A Sane Alternative

Of course, fossil fools will argue that the only alternative to burning up our remaining oil and gas supplies is for us all to live like the indigenous peoples in the Amazon. But next door to Peru you can see a very different, environmentally sane model to lift up the poor emerging — if only we will grasp it.

Ecuador is a poor country with large oil resources underneath its rainforest — but its president, Rafael Carrea, is offering us the opposite of Garcia's plan. He has announced he is willing to leave his country's largest oil reserve, the Ishpingo Tmabococha Tiputini field, under the soil if the rest of the world will match the \$9.2 billion in revenues it would provide.

If we don't start reaching for these alternatives, we will render this month's victory in the Amazon meaningless.

The Hadley Center in Britain, one of the most sophisticated scientific centers for studying the impacts of global warming,

has warned that if we carry on belching out greenhouse gases at the current rate, the humid Amazon will dry up and burn down — and soon.

Their study earlier this year explained: "The Amazonian rainforest is likely to suffer catastrophic damage even with the lowest temperature rises forecast under climate change. Up to 40 percent of the rainforest will be lost if temperature rises are restricted to 2° C. (3.6° F.), which most climatologists regard as the least that can be expected by 2050. A 3° C. (5.4° F.) rise is likely to result in 75 percent of the forest disappearing while a 4° C. (7.2° F.) rise, regarded as the most likely increase this century unless greenhouse gas emissions are slashed, will kill off 85 percent of the forest." That would send gigatons of carbon into the atmosphere — making the world even more uninhabitable.

There is something thrilling about the fight in the Amazon, yet also something shaming. These people had nothing but they stood up to the oil companies. We have everything, yet too many of us sit limp and passive, filling up our tanks with stolen oil without a thought for tomorrow.

The people of the Amazon

have shown they are up for the fight to save our ecosystem. Are we?

# **UPDATES** DEP Orders U.S. Energy to Stop Drilling in PA

The Pensylvania Department of Environmental Protection on Friday ordered U.S. Energy Development Corp. to stop oil and gas drilling operations throughout Pennsylvania for "persistent and repeated violations of environmental laws" documented at well sites in McKean and Warren counties.

Some of the company well locations cited are on Bradford Water Authority land and Allegheny National Forest land, with violations affecting the high-quality streams of Willow Creek and Bennett Brook.

According to the DEP, the Getzville, N.Y. company incurred 302 documented violations from Aug. 7, 2007 through June 30 of this year. Environmental officials said about onethird of the violations have been resolved but 197 violations remain uncorrected.

"U.S. Energy has demonstrated a pattern of behavior that displays disregard for environmental regulations and laws, the consequences being the contamination of water and soil in Warren and McKean counties," said DEP Regional Director Kelly Burch. "This order stops U.S. Energy from building new sites and gives the company 30 days to fix those sites that have already been built."

Further, the DEP said the July 10<sup>th</sup> order resulted from "continued and numerous violations of the Oil and Gas Act, the Clean Streams Law and the Solid Waste Management Act."

The order apparently allows U.S. Energy to continue producing at existing wells.

Violations identified from Aug. 7, 2007 through April 15, 2009 have been corrected but civil penalties "have not yet been resolved." Other violations identified from June 10 through June 30 have not been corrected despite DEP notices to U.S. Energy.

"Most of the uncorrected vi-

olations are in McKean County," said a DEP spokesman. **These violations include** 

the following: • clearing or disturbing more than five acres of earth with no DEP permit or approval or no

erosion or sediment controls; • discharging sediment into Bennett Brook and Willow Creek without DEP approval;

• failing to maintain adequate freeboard or maintain the liners in the pits used to temporarily contain residual and industrial wastes from the wells;

• failing to have an adequate erosion and sediment control plan at well sites representing construction at the site or failing to use such a plan;

• failing to prevent erosion and sedimentation from access roads, failing to apply adequate road material to stabilize access roads and/or failing to stabilize banks and ditches with adequate seed, fertilizer, lime and mulch;

• installing a pipeline across a tributary of Willow Creek with no DEP permit or approval; and

• failing to obtain a waiver from DEP before building a well site within 100 feet of a stream.

Under the order, U.S. Energy must immediately stop all well stimulation or drilling. road or pipeline building, "earth disturbance activities" and discharging wastes to waterways.

Within two days of the order, the company must start to rectify its errors and within 30 days must complete erosion and sediment control practices at all of its well sites. Also, such work must be overseen by a licensed professional registered in Pennsylvania. Within ten days of the order, the company must submit the additional information needed to obtain a permit for the pipeline crossing of Willow Creek and complete a waiver for a certain well site.

The company has five days to bring drill pits at each well into compliance . . . .

### PA Legislation to Protect Local Water Supply Advances

Press Release from Rep. Tina Pickett, July 7, 2009

HARRISBURG, Pennsylvania — Representative Tina Pickett (R-Bradford/Sullivan/Susquehanna) announced today that her legislation, that would amend the Pennsylvania Oil and Gas Act to increase the protection of water supplies in the state, has been approved by the House Environmental Resources and Energy Committee.

"In most cases drilling operations occur without any disruption to our daily lives but, in others, water supplies are damaged or lost due to these operations," Pickett said. "This legislation is intended to assure that the greatest precautions are taken to protect private water supplies, a vital and precious resource."

The current Oil and Gas Act, enacted in 1984, does not mandate testing of the water supply before and after drilling has occurred. Pickett's legislation would make this a requirement. Additionally, this bill will extend the time-frame for when a landowner can claim damage to the water supply from six months to 24 months.

House Bill 1205 would also expand the distance where pollution of a water supply is presumed to be caused by an oil or gas well drilling operation. Current state law permits the Department of Environmental Protection to presume a water supply has been contaminated by an oil or gas well drilling operation if it is within 1,000 feet of an oil or gas well. Pickett's legislation extends that distance to 2,000 feet.

The presumption of contamination of a water supply requires the well operator to conclusively prove his or her operation is not the cause of the pollution by using one of five criteria. Beyond this distance, the department must provide a further demonstration that the pollution in the water supply was caused by the oil or gas drilling operation.

"Pennsylvania is on the cusp of a booming drilling industry with respect to natural gas exploration in the Marcellus Shale region of the state," Pickett said. "It's clear that landowners' wells, springs and other water sources must be protected to ensure public health. Drilling operators must shoulder the responsibility for their actions. This proposal will facilitate more testing and allow for a longer period of time to claim damages."

House Bill 1205 will now be in position for consideration by the full House.

### Los Angeles' 'Coal Free' Vow Scuttles Power-Plant Expansion

## **Protester Trial:** Lessons from the Great Train Ambush

The hijack of a coal train by climate protesters and their ensuing trial both played out in a uniquely British manner.

It was a lovely sunny morning in perfect English countryside but somewhere among the fields between the M62 and Drax in North Yorkshire, something extremely atypical of this tranquil landscape was about to happen.

I wasn't sure exactly what but on the empty lanes not long after dawn it was easy to guess that the railway line servicing Drax power station might be in the sights of the climate change campaigners' next rumored protest.

Access isn't easy to the completely rural stretch of track, the sort of winding line which earlier campaigners rhapsodised about when they tried to stop Beeching's 1960s railway cuts. But after several cow-parsley fringed dead ends, I saw a man in a day-glo jacket with a red flag at an isolated level crossing, and in the distance a bridge. One heavily-laden procession of coal hoppers had already trundled past but Drax devours fossil fuel and there were no doubt more on the way. I parked, got out and checked out the supposed Network Rail employee and he looked, shall we say, just a bit "alternative." I didn't need any hints but scampered off towards the bridge — the recording I made at the time faithfully reproduces my 58-year-old puffs. Sure enough a second train was creeping up towards the river Aire crossing from the south and then it stopped. Just as I reached it and called up to the driver (these freight trains are massive and I wouldn't have fancied trying to climb aboard), a swarm of people appeared on top of the first two coal hoppers and on the girders of the bridge. Unbeknownst to me, a sophisticated operation had swung into action and worked with a precision I have only seen elsewhere by the military.

The protesters coordinated their actions using a "wedding code." The train was the "bride" in texts between the various ambushers. They were the "in-laws" and the "priests." Reconnaissance had established the bridge as the perfect place to scale the girders and then drop onboard, then to get out the shovels and start heaving coal on the tracks.

As a nervous exponent of the *Guardian*'s new technology, I concentrated on trying to hold my digital camera as steady as possible and remembering to double click the record button on my digital tape recorder. Then I had cheerful conversations with Leeds University lecturer Paul Chatterton and primary school teacher Grainne Gannon, who was dressed as a coal-miner's warning canary.

Someone then pointed out a distant figure in a blue uniform coming down the line from the level crossing where I had parked and I decided that it was probably best to concentrate on getting my information back to London. For Wi-Fi reasons, that meant finding a McDonald's so off I went, chatting briefly to the police officer and having the satisfaction of using a variant of "they went thataway," pointing down the line to the train. Listening to the court proceedings has brought it all back and particularly the good-natured way in which a non-violent but illegal and dramatic act was somehow set in what we like to think of as a traditional British context. The trial was the same; an illogical but friendly compromise reached between the judge and the 22 defendants. They pleaded not guilty to obstructing the train but admitted that they were on it, helping off-load the coal. The judge said that court would not accept evidence on climate change but sat through discussions on polar bears, dinosaurs and Arctic melt, even saying in his summing-up that they were eloquent, sincere, moving and engagingly told. The story obviously doesn't end here. The Great Train Ambush may be an interesting lesson for future generations in how democracy and justice need — and can come to terms with devices other than votes and debates to progress.

Thirty-five "missing tags" my @\$\$!

Agency — a political subdivision of the state of Utah co-owned by municipal and rural electric cooperatives — has dropped plans to build a proposed third 900-megawatt. coal-fired generating unit at the Intermountain Power Plant near Delta, Utah.

"The project has been abandoned," IPA spokesman John Ward said yesterday.

The decision came after Los Angeles Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa announced last week that the city — which purchases about 45 percent of the IPA's power — wants to end its use of coal-fired power by 2020. Villaraigosa said that the city will replace its coal-fired electricity with energy from renewable sources, natural gas, nuclear and hydroelectric power.

"We were in a permitting and preliminary planning stage and some of the expected partners determined that it wasn't going to match up with their resource objectives," Ward said.

Environmentalists praised the decision and said they expect similar projects to follow suit.

V. John White, executive director of the Center for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Technologies in Sacramento, California, said the cancellation of the unit indicates a changing perception of coal-fired power.

"It reflects a changing need of

The Sierra Club hailed the decision to abandon the plant, saying it marked the 100<sup>th</sup> plant to be prevented or abandoned since 2001.

"At the beginning of the coal rush in 2001, it seemed inevitable that as many as 150 new proposed coal plants would get built," said Bruce Nilles, director of the organization's Beyond Coal Campaign. "Since then we've seen an incredible change in the way people, businesses and governments — like Los Angeles — are thinking about energy, figuring out how to generate and use it more cleanly and efficiently. Coal is no longer a smart or cost-effective option."

Los Angeles, one of the principal owners of the plant's units 1 and 2, announced in 2007 that it did not support the construction of the third unit at the plant.

PacifiCorp and the Utah Associated Municipal Power Systems sued the city, alleging a breach of contract, but that suit was recently dismissed.

# Guide Helps Gardeners Become Leaders of Local Food Movement

PHILADELPHIA, Pennsylvania, June 16, 2009 - WORLD-WIRE — The creators of the SPIN-Gardening online learning series have launched the SPIN-Gardening Discussion and Action Guide which can be used by gardeners to create action teams to rebuild local food systems. ### Change Your Lifestyle, **Change Your Genes**

Mind-body Medicine Pioneer, Dean Ornish, MD, **Explains Surprising** New Research

Years ago, Dean Ornish, M.D., brought a well-respected yoga teacher to speak at a medical school. The teacher made a remark along the lines of, "When you do yoga, even your genes can begin to change."

Dr. Ornish winced internally, thinking, "I'm going to be the laughing-stock of the medical school because everybody knows you can't change your genes."

While that was the prevailing thought at the time, current research shows that changing your lifestyle - which could include taking up yoga — may be able to reverse heart disease, stall the progression of earlystage prostate cancer, stimulate the growth of new brain neurons and, yes, even change the way your genes behave.

Far from being a laughingstock, Dr. Ornish is now a renowned figure in the field of integrative medicine. He is the founder and president of the Preventative Medicine Research Institute, Clinical Professor of Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco and author of six best-selling books, including The Spectrum (Ballantine, 2007). He gave the keynote speech at the landmark Institute of Medicine Summit on Integrative Medicine and the Health of the Public which took place in February 2009.

Often, Dr. Ornish said, people attribute their health problems to "bad genes" or they figure that since they are genetically predisposed to, say, heart disease, they will get it no matter what they do, so they might as well continue leading unhealthy lifestyles.

tain number of brain neurons. If you went out and had a binge, you lost a few thousand of those or more and that was it. You wouldn't get them back."

These days, he continued, the new field of neuroplasticity is revealing that the brain is far less static than previously thought.

Depression, for example, can shrink your brain but treatment with cognitive behavioral therapy can return it to its previous size. And even if you're not suffering from depression, getting more exercise can stimulate the growth of new brain neurons.

'Your brain can get measurably bigger," Dr. Ornish said. "What I'm impressed by is how dynamic our bodies are. How quickly you can get better — and how quickly you can get worse - in a number of different domains."

More examples of the body's responsiveness to lifestyle change come from research related to telomerase, which he defined as "an enzyme that repairs and lengthens damaged telomeres, which are the ends of our chromosomes that control how long we live."

In 2004, Dr. Elizabeth Blackburn FRS, Professor of Biology and Physiology at the University of California, San Francisco, Fellow of the Royal Society and the co-discoverer of telomerase, coauthored what Dr. Ornish described as a "pioneering study" that appeared in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences. The study, which examined mothers of chronically ill children, found that the women with the highest perceived levels of emotional stress had lower levels of telomerase and shorter telomeres than the women with the lowest perceived levels of stress. In fact, on average, the most-stressed women had the telomerase levels and telomere lengths of someone ten years older.

Conversely, a study published in The Lancet Oncology in September 2008 found that, after following the lifestyle plan outlined in The Spectrum for three months, the telomerase activity levels of men with early-stage prostate cancer increased by 30%. Dr. Ornish and Dr. Blackburn were among the study authors. A longer follow-up study will determine whether there were corresponding increases in telomere lengths.

**Leatherback Turtle Nests** on Jekyll Island, Georgia

(Mindy and David Egan, founders of The Initiative to Protect Jekyll Island, helped to prepare this story.)

At approximately 2:30 a.m. Saturday, May 30 the Georgia Sea Turtle patrol discovered a leatherback turtle building a nest on the dunes between Blackbeard's Restaurant and the convention center. It is the first leatherback nesting in the memory of most Islanders and could very well be the first documented leatherback nesting on Jekyll Island. Leatherback nestings on the Georgia coast are rare. To date, in 2009, there has been one on Sapelo Island, one on Sea Island and now one on Jekyll.

While difficult to estimate to the untrained eye, the female appeared to be between five and six feet long and in the range of 1,000 pounds. The nesting process from the time she was sighted until she returned to the ocean at approximately 7:30 a.m. was about five hours - she was probably on the beach for at least an hour before being seen, which suggests that she would have been on shore at least six hours in

toto. She first attempted to dig a nest at the toe of the dune and had excavated the cavity to hold the eggs. That site was apparently unsatisfactory and abandoned. She moved higher up into the dune ridge, dug another nest, deposited her eggs (estimated to be around 80) and carefully and laboriously covered the nest before heading back to the ocean.

The nesting was closely observed and recorded by Georgia Sea Turtle Center personnel who had been alerted by the turtle patrol. Clearly this was a once-in-a-lifetime event for many of the scientists, staff and interns who were present - all were agog and overwhelmed by the sheer size of the reptile. Photographs and movies do not adequately prepare you for meeting a leatherback at arm's length without any barriers around. It can be humbling.

We were advised by some of the experts on hand that leatherbacks

(similar to loggerheads) become sexually active between 20 and 30 years old. When they begin nesting, they will nest every third year. During the nesting year they may build six to eight nests and deposit 80 to 100 eggs per nest. The nestings usually occur about 10 days apart. The eggs, which are larger than the ping-pong-ball-sized loggerhead eggs will incubate in their sand enclosure for about 55 days.

With a great deal of luck, in 2040 some of the progeny may return to Jekyll Island.

Young "Miss May Jekyll" was escorted to the ocean by all present who watched until she disappeared from sight about 100 yards off shore. With any luck at all, she will be back in ten days for another close encounter. One cannot help but wonder if, under the new lighting ordinance, the now dark Jekyll beaches are more inviting to leath-

## Why Are They Destroying Weapons of **Mass Destruction in Washington, D.C.?**

Who's Looking Out for the Public's Health and Safety?

The Army Corps of Engineers might have to postpone their plans to destroy World War I chemical munitions using the Explosives Destruction System (EDS) in Spring Valley until after Labor Day due to the increased attention the project has recently received and to get permission from the U.S. Army.

The Army produced a fiveminute video demonstrating this technology, which I've linked to on the "WMD in DC" photo blog at http://wmdindc.blogspot. com/2009/05/munition-destructive-system-uses-toxic.html.

In May, the District of Columbia City Council's Committee on Government Operations and the Environment held a roundtable panel on Spring Valley.

In June, the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform held another hearing on Spring Valley.

At the Congressional hearing, Representative Jason Chaffetz (R-UT) asked the Army, the Army Corps and the EPA if residents and workers in Spring Valley were safe.

There was dead silence.

The government witnesses huddled with their consultants for what seemed like minutes before the Army Corps' Colonel Mueller said, "It's getting safer every day!"

It wasn't very reassuring. After 16 years of cleanup, had



they never asked this question themselves or were they just figuring out how to answer the question without perjuring themselves?

Is there something they aren't telling us?

Both chemical and conventional munitions have been recovered over the past 16 years in Spring Valley primarily from the 52<sup>nd</sup> Court Pit and the Glenbrook Road Burial Pit — a property owned by American University, which was the birthplace of the Chemical Warfare Service during World War I.

The Army Corps of Engineers has not provided much

information regarding the recovered munitions, citing homeland security issues and possible terrorist activity. The Army Corps has refused to say what chemicals the munitions contain, what chemicals will have to be shipped into the District to neutralize the chemical warfare agents or what hazardous waste material will have to be trucked out of the neighborhood.

The Army Corps has not provided this basic information to Representative Eleanor Holmes

Norton, Mayor Adrian Fenty, Councilmember Mary Cheh, the Director of the District's Department of Environment (George Hawkins) or Police Chief Cathy Lanier. This poses a serious problem,

especially for first responders. How do you respond to an emergency situation when you don't know what toxic chemicals are involved?

In addition, during the munitions destruction process, each munition produces 200-400 gallons of hazardous waste, which will likely be shipped to a hazardous waste facility in Port

A proposed Law that effectively bans and forever prohibits the deployment or otherwise released into or onto the Earth's Natural Atmospheric/Stratospheric column and Breathable Air Column.

This Law will prohibit-theformation or Act as an Instrument for dissolution targeting the U.S. Weather Control Board or Agency. Weather manipulation is a part of identified function and purpose of the toxic chemicals and biological mutation agents, therefore, Weather Modification and Control will be prohibited due to the absolute toxicity profile of the agents used for manipulation, management or controls. An independent Environmental Impact Study must be conducted prior to considerations of Agricultural spraying of any sort and which must include all negative effects of Genetically Mutated species on all Life Forms within a 100 Mile radius of the potentially effected area. # Cell Phones and Children Don't Mix

My guest this week is Shelly Kalnitsky of Wave Shield and the Cell Phone Radiation News Bureau (CPRN), a voluntary research and information network. CPRN was created to educate people on the latest news concerning cell phones.

Today we're talking about cell phones and children. Children are at greatest risk from cell phone radiation because their brain tissues are still developing. Shelly noted that cell phone users exhibit addictive behavior, constantly checking their phones and even leaving movie theatres to take calls.

Shelly found a material that blocks 99% of radiation [Ed: See note at end of article.] that is used to protect people who work in radioactive environments. He created a product called Wave Shield that you can simply stick on your cell or cordless phone. The ear happens to have the highest absorption rate of radiation of any area in the body.

A recent study from UCLA showed that pregnant women who use cell phones can increase their child's risk of autism. A world-renowned neurosur-

The Web site lists cell phone manufacturers' product radiation levels. It would be smart to check their listings to buy a model with lower radiation levels the next time you purchase a phone. Headset phones that stay on your ear are especially dangerous.

Reports have shown that a man's fertility can be negatively affected when his phone is kept on his hip.

Some people notice symptoms from their computer monitors as well, especially if they use a computer for several hours a day.

Shelly comments that everyone who claims that cell phones are safe are either ignorant of the facts or getting a paycheck from the industry.

Note from Shelly: If you are duplicating this story from that radio show there is one major error. Wave Shield does not block 99% of all the radiation. 

### Friends of Animals Win: African Antelope Shielded From Safari Club and Trophy Tourists

#### WASHINGTON D.C., June 23, 2009 WORLD-WIRE (*excerpt*) — A decision has been issued in Friends of Animals v. Ken Salazar (Civil Action 04-01660): The Interior Department's U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) violated the Endangered Species Act (ESA) by issuing a blanket exemption allowing trophy hunting at U.S. ranches of endangered African antelopes.

Friends of Animals ("FoA") and others sued the Fish and Wildlife Service of the Department of Interior on the grounds that the Service unlawfully exempted U.S.-bred scimitarhorned oryx, addax and dama gazelles from prohibitions against harming, harassing, pursuing, hunting, shooting, wounding, killing, trapping, capturing or collecting endangered species.

Section 10 of the ESA allows some uses for "scientific purposes or to enhance the propagation or survival of the affected species," if the government publishes notice and allows for public comment for each "good faith" application for an exemption or permit at every stage of the proceeding. It does not provide a means to authorize the sport hunting of these animals.

The antelopes at issue are native to northern Africa. Today, addax and dama gazelles are nearly wiped out due to hunting, war, desertification of habitat, human settlement and agribusiness. Scimitar-horned oryx are virtually extinct; most live on Texas hunting ranches where they are bred.

In 2005, following a Friends of Animals lawsuit, these antelopes were listed as endangered but the government issued a rule creating a loophole for captive-bred antelope, claiming "captive breeding in the United States has contributed significantly to the conservation of these species."

"This is disingenuous," said

Lee Hall, legal director for Friends of Animals, noting that the Service's exemption follows similar fragmentations of ESA listings, resulting in removal of protections for gray wolves, Gunnison's prairie dogs and Queen Charlotte goshawks for political and commercial purposes.

Under Bush's leadership, the federal government has eroded the Act's protections to cater to local governments and special interests. In July 2008, for instance, the Service removed protections for Preble's meadow jumping mice in Wyoming while keeping the Colorado populations on the endangered species list — so protections would end at the state line.

"The Obama administration must reject this fragmentation of the Endangered Species Act," said Hall. "We're glad the party's over for ranches that allow hunters to kill antelopes . . .

# Secrets of Grinding and Processing Grains

By Al Fry Garden Valley, Idaho

#### Part II (See last month for Part I.)

While grain grinders are important kitchen tools for providing nutrient-rich flour, there are other tools I use to get the oxygen-rich oils that the body needs for health.

Nobel prize winner, Otto Warburg, found that only unprocessed oils from nuts, seeds and animal products provided the cells with enough oxygen to resist the usual degenerative diseases. (See "The Hidden Story of Cancer" at 800-456-9941.)

Virtually all the present processed cooking oils are an abomination and should be shunned in view of Warburg's data. This is easy to pick up on in the huge increase in cancer and such after the time when such oils and hydrogenated transfat-loaded foods were introduced.

To get the raw, nutrient-rich oils I need, I use a mixture of sunflower, flax and sesame seeds with almonds, cashews and whatever nuts and seeds I find appealing and a bargain.

To grind the oily nuts into spread, I typically use an Omega Juicer with a worm impeller. This easily squeezes all these seeds and nuts into a mash or pulp and, with a dash of olive oil, water, salt, honey, etc., a very delicious spread can be made up in minutes. If the price of one of the impeller-type juicers is a bit spendy on the budget, a little whirly blade nut grinder will work to some degree. Food choppers and blenders can sometimes be made to work by dulling the sharp blades or reversing them so they 'smash' the nuts. If all else fails, you can add enough liquid to blend the mixture firm enough, remembering that oxygen kills vitamins and nutrients and only small batches should be made up. Soaking seeds, etc. overnight allows easy processing.

If a roasted flavor is desired in the spread, I only roast a small portion of the seeds, etc. since this heat will also cut down on the nutritional properties of the spread. A handful of seeds can easily be pan-roasted and many other flavorenhancing strategies can be used. I like using soy sauce (without MSG additives), miso for flavor and honey and stevia for sweetening effects. Carob nibs, dates and oatmeal can be mixed with the spread to make up granola or candy bars. A couple of such bars in the morning and one will often not even crave anything else to eat. The usual "munchies" that people have are simply the body's frustration at not getting enough suitable nutrients.

Most larger cities have co-ops and supermarkets with many seeds and nuts in their bulk-food sections. Health food stores can often special order both the processors and the nuts and seeds in bulk. A major supplier of commercial nut grinders is Old Tyme at 413-525-4101. You will see their machines filled with peanuts in many larger markets.

Since monkeys instinctively remove the small germ from peanuts before they eat them, you might take the hint. Banging them around in a bag and then allowing the smaller germ to get sifted through a suitable sieve solved this problem.

Roasted soy beans are also passed over for reasons of their greatly inhibiting the human immune system. Many articles have come out on this since the '80s but still soy is being hidden in many food products.

One grain that greatly boosts the immune system is rye. Roman soldiers were issued rye and ate it in solar-dried cakes (unleavened bread) to reduce the incidence of camp-follower diseases. Adding a dash of rve kernals to the usual spread mixtures is a wise move.

Cedar tree nuts also have a reputation for building health and, since the Anastasia books promote them, they are getting shipped in from Russia for her fans.

Many other possibilities exist and the bottom line is simply to remember that heat and roasting kill the life force and healing qualities of whatever nuts and seeds you are using.

*Continued from page 2* Pennsylvania's, the fresh, organic, vegetarian meal is a delightfully delicious alternative to travel rest stops.

The farm features U-pick fields to allow others to experience the joy of working with nature and learning how real food is grown. Part of Maggie's Organics mission is to create a resource center which sets an example of what Earth-friendly living is meant to be.

The farm buildings scattered on the land are named according to the nearest field such as Raspberry, Strawberry, Asparagus, Grape and Kiwi. I did not know we grew Kiwis in Pennsylvania.

Each year, Maggie's sponsors the Farm Festival featuring 'green' speakers, craftspeople, live entertainment, activities for children, tractor rides and delicious fresh food offerings.

Other activities at this year's Farm Festival included entertainment by several musicians and a drum circle plus a performance by Jim Donovan and 'Drum the Ecstatic.' Jim provided Afri-

can hand drums for everyone and within minutes had a group of more than 35 adults and children drumming together and smiling. He led the group through rhythms from simple to complex and even had us singing and drumming at the same time.

The tractor rides also seemed to be quite popular. I tasted the delicious fresh fruit and vegetable smoothie but was a bit too late to sample some of Maggie's organic ice cream.

The farm store had copies of Derrick Jensen's books and Earth-friendly products as well as freshly harvested organic produce.

It was a lovely day (in between the sudden thunderstorm and brisk wind gusts) to wander around the farm, discover each of the well-maintained fields, orchards and gardens and experience nature surrounding us in all its glory.

A personal highlight of the day for me was meeting Maggie and experiencing first-hand her enthusiasm and positive energy. She is clearly a different kind of

farmer in an enlightened way and she certainly seems to love her work.

specific needs and to raise issues that help realign policy research agendas to meet them.

"Women are already engaged in farming and are seeking ways in which to increase their production and earnings." Ndema explains that women farmers are often marginalized in business relations and have little control over access to land, seed and fertilizer as well as credit and technology. Currently, women make up 70 percent of the total agricultural workforce in Sub-Saharan Africa. They are responsible for 100 percent of the processing of basic foodstuffs, according to the latest Food and Agricultural Organization statistics. Ndema says that community theater will help bridge the gap between researchers' knowledge and the communities involved in the project. "We need to get to the local level and increase these farmers' understanding of input markets whilst also educating researchers once we gain insight from the communities," says Ndema . . .

# **Rare Birds Protected**

The Service itself acknowledges the benefits of listing foreign species to draw worldwide attention to their plight, to make available U.S. expertise and U.S. funds and to compel the strict regulation of the import and export of protected species.

In order to adhere to the negotiated timeline, the Fish and Wildlife Service promises to publish final listing determinations for these six species of seabirds:

• Chatham petrel, Pterodroma axillaris; in New Zealand;

• Magenta petrel, Pterodroma magentae; in New Zealand;

• Cook's petrel, Pterodroma cookii, in New Zealand;

• Fiji petrel, Pterodroma macgillivrayi, in Fiji (fewer than 50 birds remain);

• Galapagos petrel, Pterodroma phaeopygia, in Ecuador; and

• Heinroth's shearwater, Puffinus heinrothi, in Papua New Guinea.

Behind the name of each species is a story. For instance, the Galapagos petrel, which breeds only on Ecuador's Galapagos Islands, has declined rapidly over the past 60 years and is now classified as Critically Endangered on the International Union for the Conservation of Nature's Red List of Threatened species. Estimates for 2008 suggested a total of 4,500 to 5,000 active nests on five Galapagos islands. These sea birds breed and forage on and around the islands but disperse east and north towards South America and fly up to 2,000 kilometers (1,242 miles) south of the Galapagos.

Introduced dogs, cats and pigs take eggs, young and adults, and rats eat the petrel chicks. Hawks and owls may take adult

birds. Nest-site destruction by goats, donkeys, cattle and horses is a major threat. Clearance of vegetation for agriculture and intensive grazing has severely restricted the petrels' breeding area.

Adult mortality occurs when Galapagos petrels are caught on barbed wire fences on agricultural land and collide with power lines and radio towers and guy wires. Development of a wind power project on the island of Santa Cruz was a potential threat to many breeding colonies on that island but the development plan aims to minimize effects on the species.

Long-line fishing in the eastern Pacific and in the Galapagos Marine Reserve is a threat because the petrels dive on the baited lines and get snagged or entangled.

The Galapagos Islands are a national park and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Proposed conservation measures include rat eradication and protection of more marine key biodiversity areas within the Galapagos Marine Reserve by changing the existing marine zoning scheme to reduce the impact from fishing.

As part of the settlement with the Center for Biological Diversity, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will propose listings for these species:

• Junin rail, Laterallus tuerosi, Peruvian Andes;

• Brazilian merganser, Mergus octosetaceus, South America;

• Caucau guan, Crax alberti, northern Colombia;

• Blue-billed curassow, Penelope perspicax, Colombian Andes;

• Gorgeted wood-quail, Odontophorus strophium, Colombian Andes;

• Southeastern rufousvented groundcuckoo, Neomorphus geoffroyi dulcis, South America; • Margaretta's hermit, hummingbird, Phaethornis malaris margarettae, Mexico to Argentina;

• Esmeraldas woodstar, hummingbird, Chaetocerus berlepschi, South America;

• Royal cinclodes, Cinclodes aricomae, Peruvian and Bolivian Andes;

• White-browed tit-spinetail, Leptasthenura xenothorax, south-central Peru;

• Black-hooded antwren, Formicivora erythronotos, southern coastal Brazil;

• Fringe-backed fire-eye, Pyriglena atra, southern coastal Brazil;

• Brown-banded antpitta, Grallaria milleri, Colombian Andes;

• Kaempfer's tody-tyrant, Hemitriccus kaempferi, southeast Brazil;

• Ash-breasted tit-tyrant, Anairetes alpinus, high Andes of Peru and Bolivia;

Peruvian plantcutter, Phytotoma raimondii; South America;
Cherry-throated tana-

ger, Nemosia rourei, South America; • Greater adjutant stork, Leptoptilos dubius, India,

*Continued from page 1* Salvador and ProNatura in Mexico to identify and manage priority wintering sites will benefit from this round of grant funding. There will be financial support for 40 existing monitoring stations throughout Mexico, Central and South America and another 10 monitoring stations will be established to fill gaps in the net-

work. SalvaNatura and ProNatura have received further funding for their work in the pine-oak forests of Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua and northern El Salvador, which provide critical winter habitat for the Endangered goldencheeked warbler, Dendroica chrysoparia and 55 other neotropical migratory species.

ProNatura has received funding for conservation work at the El Ocote and Chimalapas Important Bird Areas and at the Calakmul, Mapimí and Sierra de la Laguna Biosphere Reserves, which the bird experts say are all of great importance for neotropical migrants.

There is further funding for the Veracruz River of Raptors initiative, which seeks to improve protection for the five million raptors of 25 species which migrate via a geographic bottleneck between the Sierra Madre Oriental and the Gulf of BirdLife partner Guyra Paraguay's work at Bahia de Asuncion will include developing tools to increase local awareness about the environment, reducing harmful behavior and involving the community in conservation projects.

Aves & Conservacion, which is the BirdLife partner in Ecuador, will use its grant to strengthen local capacities in research, monitoring and ecotourism at two artificial salt lakes in the Santa Elena Peninsula, establishing site support groups and building alliances with local universities.

U.S. Interior Secretary Ken Salazar said, "These grants will support important multinational partnership projects throughout the hemisphere so future generations of people in North, Central and South America can enjoy and appreciate these remarkable birds."

The Neotropical Migratory Bird Conservation Act of 2000 established the matching grants program to fund projects promoting the conservation of Neotropical migratory birds in the United States, Canada, Latin America and the Caribbean.

By law, at least 75 percent of the money goes to projects in Latin America, the Caribbean and Canada, while the remaining 25 percent can go to projects in the United States.

A number of the grant enable the National Audubon Society, which is BirdLife in the United States, to restore habitats and improve the protection of migration corridors within the United States. Audubon also is involved in many of the projects outside U.S. borders. Based in Cambridge, England, BirdLife International was created to ensure that birds, their habitats and other biodiversity were conserved using the best available information, practices and resources. The Americas Program is implemented by the BirdLife Americas Partnership of 15 conservationist organizations supported by the BirdLife Americas Division and Cambridge Secretariat. The Americas Division Office located in Quito, Ecuador, receives the support of the Brazil and Caribbean programs that facilitate and coordinate BirdLife partnership activities.

Close Encounters of the Bird Kind:

A Story About Window Decals

When birds intersect with windows, the outcome is quite often not in the bird's favor, as depicted in the photo, right. This female American goldfinch broke her neck when she unwittingly flew into a double-hung window on Terry Darling's porch.

Birds fly into windows because they see a reflection of clouds, trees and sky. Millions of birds die each year from collisions with windows.

What's a bird lover to do?

One quick solution is to invest in self-adhesive, static-cling decals for your windows, available from many bird-feeding supply catalogs and Web sites. (Use key word 'decal' or 'window decal' or 'window collision.') Or try a less expensive option make your own or have children create window art using the same types of shapes as the decals.

Follow-up email: I just ordered some more decals for our windows. They came today. After the poor goldfinch, I felt guilty for being such a cheapskate! I was not sure if you would want to post the name of a company that sells anti-collision window decals, as that would seem an endorsement. But I ordered mine from a company called Whispering Pines. I bought 16 and, with shipping, they cost less than \$16. They have a nice variety. I bought chickadees in a variety of activities. Each one is about 3.5-4.5" high and about that wide.

The raptors soar over Mexico's east coast 20 miles north of Veracruz from August through November. On any given day, hundreds or thousands of birds, 20 or 30 across and many deep, pass overhead on their way south for the winter.

Another Important Bird Area that will benefit from support for monitoring, management and public education is Bahia de Asuncion in Paraguay, a site of international importance for migratory shorebirds.

Also a Ramsar Wetland of International Importance, the Bahia de Asuncion is a stopover for south-bound migrant waterbirds. Despite being close to the City of Asuncion waterfront, some 260 bird species have been recorded there. During winter, it receives an influx of southern migrants, including numerous species of ducks and grebes and rare raptors such as the Southern crested-caracara, Polyborus plancus.

### Mercury for Your Entrée? A Side of Sodium?

"Are PETA [People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals], CSPI [Center for Science in the Public Interest], and Greenpeace running your Marketing Department?" Anyone can find these ad headlines on page 8 of a publication: *Restaurant News* (May 25th, 2009 and subsequent issues). Unlike most of the articles within *Restaurant News*; this ad attacks. The ad declares PETA, CSPI and GREENPEACE anti-industry and claims these groups' beliefs are 'junk science.'

The ad I'm referring to is a full-page, color ad (15" x 12") featuring an oversized fictitious restaurant menu, complete with sample appetizers and entrees with sunburst bullets accenting each food item with the following notations: \*No Trans Fats, \*Low Sodium, \*Locally Grown, \*Low Mercury, \*Free-Range Beef, \*No Calorie Drink and \*Cage-Free Eggs. This mock up menu is similar to what we have begun to see at eatin, family-style chain restaurants. Other than \*Cage-Free Eggs and \*Free Range Beef, I've been stymied as to what "low sodium, "no trans-fats," "no calorie drink" have to do with PETA or Greento jump on the bandwagon now to fight for trans-fat and mercury justice! Or fight for high fat and high sugar drinks! Or demand the return of 3,000 mg sodium side dishes. Does this sound silly?

It isn't for many folks in the food industry. Many restaurateurs are hoping that you won't find out what is really in your food.

In a sense, I suppose their ad against alerting consumers to a menu that touts healthier options might be a bit like junk, as they claim. I will give them some credit, but for a different reason.

For example, the menu draws attention to food with huge star\*bursts over a three-layer chocolate cake with icing as being made with 'cage-free' eggs. Ideally, this is not enough for me. I'd like the cake to be animal-fat-free, using organic or non-GMO (genetically modified organisms) flour and Fair Trade 70% dark chocolate. Advertising their cake as supreme for one's health because it was made using cage-free eggs is phony and a poor specimen for this anti-environmentalist group to plug.

"We" will be the healthier ones. Vegetarians and those that chose the so called 'alarmist food lifestyles' are uniting nationwide to report significant health gains. Film stars, popular athletes and others who have become vegetarians (LeBron James, Natalie Portman and Paul McCartney) know that, compared to their previous meat-eating lifestyle, they are in better health (PETA, 2009). Farmers observing free-range methods are reporting renewed satisfaction due to implementing sustainable, consciously-appealing practices. Locavores (those who eat food grown close to home) can feel inner peace each time a family meal is created their way. Yet, an organization: ConsumerFreedom.org seems to want mercury, transfats, factory-farmed eggs and sodiumrich foods in your diet. I have to wonder if ConsumerFreedom.org was part of the industry that chose to 'alarm' us that First Lady Michelle Obama was sending the wrong message to U.S. citizens by creating an organic food garden at the White House. I imagine 'locally grown,' 'organic' and/ or 'low sodium' might mean something to Michelle Obama and that's what concerns groups that are against progress, change and specific labeling requirements. Incidentally, has anyone else noticed that the press, when referring to The White House Garden has dropped the 'organic' label? Was there pressure from groups like ConsumerFreedom? I visited ConsumerFreedom.org online as the ad suggests and I invite each reader of "OE" to go to this site as well. It's good to see that we are unnerving them and that they are troubled by our efforts to chose foods wisely and equally troubling for them is that we are demanding our lawmakers to pay better attention to current industry standards. Desiring to do so is not only an improvement for our health but greener for our environment by ultimately creating conscious consumers who possibly lower everyone's carbon footprint

# *Val's Column* Mr. Sweetie's Story Horses Need Your Help **Now**

Walking into a horse auction with \$140.00 in my pocket, many things raced through my mind. I wasn't sure how or even if I could rescue a horse and just the idea of being surrounded with the hopeless and sickening things that go on at auctions almost kept me from going. As it turns out, that meager amount of money was all I needed to save one poor horse from a long, painful trip to a slaughterhouse and a panicked, scary, horrible end to his life.

As soon as I walked into the auction, I spotted him. He was white. (In the horse world, white horses are called grays.) He was a large pony; his ribs stuck out and he looked in bad shape and as if he was in pain. I could not bear the thought of him being hauled to slaughter, crammed in with other horses. I knew that most likely he would fall from weakness in the trailer and would get kicked and trampled by other, healthier horses. I decided that I had to get him out. While I was looking around at other horses, though, he was sent into the auction ring and in under two minutes, sold to a slaughter buyer.

By the time I realized it, he had already been placed into the kill pen with the other horses that had been bought by that particular slaughter buyer. Slaughter buyers work for the various horse slaughterers buying horses. They attend every horse auction and are known by most people regularly attending these auctions.

I went up to the slaughter buyer who had bought the pony and asked whether I could buy the pony from him. He told me to pay for the pony at the cashier, bring back the receipt and I could go get him out of the kill pen. The buyer had paid \$120 for him; the extra \$20 I had to give him was, I guess, for the trouble the buyer would have to go through to replace the pony with another horse headed for slaughter.

When I went into the kill pen, I went up to the pony and spoke to him. He was responsive and obedient as I led him out of the pen. When I first went into the pen, another large, very nice looking grey horse came up to me and followed me around. The pony I had selected was safe and after attending the rest of the auction, I made arrangements for him to be transported to a temporary barn. I took the pony to the auction vet who drew blood for a Coggins test, a test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA). Horses going to slaughter are not tested for EIA. When my friend came with the trailer, the pony would not go on. I

had some carrots with me and went inside to the front of the trailer while my friend waited at the back of the trailer with him. I called to him, saying, "Come on, Sweetie." He walked right onto the trailer in response to my voice (and the carrots of course!). That did it; his name became Mr. Sweetie.

It was already very cold outside. We took Mr. Sweetie to a nice, deeply bedded stall with hay and water. I said good-night to him and left to tell my husband I would soon be home and that I had rescued a horse from the auction.

Mr. Sweetie was indeed hurting; he lay down almost immediately in the stall and rested, off his feet, for an entire two days. When a vet came to examine him, she said that he was over 30 years old. This is quite old for a horse; in human years, this is the rough equivalent of being 90 years old.

It is hard to know exactly what kind of life Mr. Sweetie had before I met him. From his gentleness and responsiveness to kindness, it is quite possible he was a show pony in his younger days. When he went to his new barn and was surrounded by adoring girls, he seemed to be completely in his element.

#### A Two-Minute Chance for Life

When I first went into the pen, another large, very nice looking grey horse came up to me and followed me around. I've been in kill pens at other auctions and some of the horses already sense the danger they are in. The large grey horse acted this way and would not leave my side. I had to shut my eyes and heart from saving him, too. I have always wondered what happened to him. Some horses are trucked from auction to auction and run through several auctions before they reach their final home or destination, so it is possible he was bought by someone who would give him a home. More likely, he was not and ended up being slaughtered.

Auctions are hard to go to if one loves horses. It is extremely difficult to see horses and know the horrible end that awaits those not bought by private owners. Many people do not understand that horses are slaughtered for meat that is shipped overseas to France, Italy, Belgium and Japan. It is a huge, ugly business. A woman at that auction had brought her mare and the mare's sweet yearling to the auction to be sold. She spent hours before the auction brushing her mare in the hopes that someone would find her attractive and buy her. She was right; someone bought her mare. And her young, pretty filly was sold to slaughter. Did the owner

not know? Did she not care?

After the auction was done, I waited for a friend of mine to pick me and the pony up. I hung around the various pens of sold horses and watched all the horses sold to slaughter being beaten into large single- and doubledecker cattle trucks. One sweet mare stopped just short of going into the trailer; she looked around the holding pens as if trying to decide whether she should go onto the trailer or not. She was beaten until she got onto the trailer. It was sickening and maddening seeing all of these horses treated this way. I could only comfort myself with the thought that I had rescued one

Horses taken to auction literally have one to two minutes being trotted in a ring to attempt to impress someone enough to be given a nice home. It is an impossible task but is all that is afforded to horses and ponies at auction. If given more time, outside of the auction setting, it is my belief that every horse or pony brought to auction is the perfect horse or pony for someone. It takes time, time that horse owners don't give horses who have many times given their all.

#### The Fate of Many Beloved Companions

Show ponies, million-dollar racehorses and camp horses can somehow or other end up at auctions. This means that about 80% of all horses sent to auction are sold to slaughter, facing hours, even days, of cramped trailer rides getting no feed or water, eventually winding up at slaughter houses in Canada and Mexico. The sad fact is that someone's beloved show pony or companion may wind up being taken to an auction after being sold from owner to owner. Or, (s)he could have been a lesson- or camp-horse at some point.

These horses and ponies are true champions. They spend years of their lives taking care of young and new riders; they depend on the heart of the owner of the lesson barn or camp. Every end of summer, thousands of camp horses and ponies are taken to auction as they are no longer "needed." Many racehorses are taken to auction when they are injured or are no longer making money. Foals born as by-products of the Premarin© industry are sold for slaughter. ("Premarin" is short for "pregnant mare urine" and is a female hormone replacement drug.) And the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) sells wild horses and burros to persons who turn around and sell these horses at auction for slaughter.

peace? Suddenly, the reader is to suppose that lowering your sodium and caloric intake and/or eliminating transfats came from PETA or Greenpeace's directions.

What happened to the voice of the Surgeon General? Did this ad try to nullify your common sense and the authority of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Center for Communicable Diseases, National Institutes of Health, Federal Drug Administration, Department of Health and Human Services, American Heart Association, American Medical Association, American Diabetes Association, and/or the National Cancer Institute? These organizations are not without faults (as many of us have learned); however this ad doesn't give any of the aforementioned agencies credit and tries to void any progressive thought process belonging to 'you' the consumer.

### Here is what the remainder of the ad touts:

"Anti-industry activists have successfully attacked the public with scare tactics and junk science about trans fats, high-fructose corn syrup, sodium acrylandide and a host of other issues. And food companies often make mountains out of molehills by using the activists' emotional language in their own marketing materials. If you give organized lunatics control over your products and sales, you'll quickly find yourself with less of both. DON'T PUT JUNK SCI-ENCE ON THE MENU."

#### I had several reactions:

**#1** Wow, environmentalists are scaring industry experts and this consumer ad agency. This is great!

**#2** We (organized lunatics) must be scaring them on too many issues to mention, since the end of the sentence states "...and a host of other issues."

**#3** Since when would anyone desire to ingest mercury?

**#4** Now that we know better, why would anyone go out of their way to eat trans-fats?

**#5** "And food companies often make mountains out of molehills..." That is a bold statement in a restaurant news magazine, since their target reading audience is food companies. Trouncing activists was not enough; they also offended some of their own readers.

Not only has this ad made an exaggerated and foolish claim, but it may encouage wildly-alarmed restaurateurs Would you like to learn more?

Please watch the activity for Menu Education and Labeling (MEAL) Act, sponsored by Senator Tom Harkin and Congresswoman Rosa DeLauro: S. 1048, HR2426 introduced in May 2009 "To amend the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act to extend the food labeling requirements of the Nutrition Labeling and Education Act of 1990 to enabl -le customers to make informed choices about the nutritional content of standard menu items in large chain restau-

*Continued from page 5* cancer (a specific class of Ras oncogenes) as well as the genes that control inflammation and oxidative stress."

Those results were published in the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences* in June 2008.

Inflammation and oxidative stress are considered important underlying mechanisms for diabetes, coronary heart disease and metabolic syndrome, among other conditions.

Technically, he acknowledged, you can't change the genes themselves. "But you can change how they're expressed by modifying the proteins that turn on or turn off these genes. If you can turn off a gene that's disease-promoting, then effectively you've changed your genes — at least functionally, if not structurally."

The healthcare system in the United States has been slow to embrace lifestyle-change approaches to managing serious illness. But that is changing. Medicare now covers the Dr. Ornish Program for Reducing Heart Disease — a comprehensive lifestylechange program shown in clinical research to reverse even severe heart disease without drugs or surgery.

"I'm cautiously optimistic that the world is catching up with us," Dr. Ornish said.

After giving the keynote speech at the Institute of Medicine summit, he testified before the Senate Health Reform committee about how preventative integrative-medicine practices, such as lifestyle changes, could save the country billions of dollars in healthcare costs and help affordably extend healthcare coverage to more people.

Key among his recommendations were:

• Change the reimbursement system to pay for integrative-medicine practices that have been proven safe and effective;

• Fund more scientific studies of integrative medicine;

• Incentivize wellness in healthcare plans and on corporate worksites;

• Serve healthy lunches in school cafeterias; and

• Change subsidies in the Farm Bill to make it cheaper to eat healthy foods than junk foods.

Through the efforts of Dr. Ornish and others, awareness of the medical efficacy of lifestyle change is spreading through the public consciousness.

"For me," he said, "awareness is always the first step in healing. Just knowing these changes can make a difference so quickly can empower people and . . . motivate them to make these changes."

## FARMERS AND CONSUMERS AS FOOD ACTIVISTS

Every so often I'm asked to speak to a college or high school class. It's an opportunity for me to voice my thoughts — most of which come to me when I'm working in the field.

Because I'm a relic of the 1960s, my main message is that young people have the power to make change happen. Many of their parents, teachers and elders have bought into some unholy concepts — and I attempt to offer different — perhaps heretical — thoughts they should think about.

So here are a few:

**1.** I offer them a choice of a red or blue pill (referring to the Matrix films) and suggest they are living in a false corporatedominated mindset reality. They are programmed by TV, the movies, video games, schools and advertising in how to eat, dress (I ask how many are wearing corporate logos on their clothing), consume and think. The alternatives they now have are cynicism and anger. I offer activism - community, electoral and spiritual activist involvement.

2. I also advocate involvement in local and state politics. National politics are sexy and alluring — but change can more readily happen at the local level — school boards, county and city councils, state electoral politics. The right wingers recognized that and began organizing

locally in the '70s and succeeded in motivating a large portion of the electorate. Name recognition in politics and the financial advantage of incumbents is central, so once elected (even dog catcher), any elected official has a better chance of re-election and moving up than an unknown. To test out my assumptions, I ask students to ask their parents what state electoral district they live in. In Maryland, parents should at least know the name of one of

their three delegates and their state (not federal) senator. They most likely won't. I encourage students to read metro sections and local newspapers and become more aware of local issues. **3.** I suggest the food they're

consuming in their school and community is killing them. I tell them (especially inner-city students) they're eating rat poison! A diet of foods laden with high fat, fried, high fructose corn syrup will encourage type 2 diabetes. Every inner-city classroom is filled with children whose parents, aunts, uncles or other relatives have "sugar" (diabetes). And our culture of capitalism-gone-amok, with few watchdogs or whistle blowers, enables and encourages us to make poor food choices. The U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Food and Drug Administration have failed us miserably when it comes to providing creative and imaginative leadership.

**4.** I tell them that their super-

markets are filled with food that causes them more harm than good. Red meat, white flour and candy all should be eaten in moderation if at all. Our bodies sometimes crave these oftenaddictive, foods. But children should be encouraged to eat a diet of greens, whole grains, locally-grown vegetables, fruits and juices (not sugary imitations but pure juices). In many schools I visit, I've been told and shown that teachers reward their students with candy, McDonald's coupons, donuts and cola products! There must be a more consistent message if we're to be credible.

5. I advocate the complete elimination of vending machines in public schools. It's been a way corporations have brought their products into our classrooms in an effort to "brand" and addict children. Principals, parents and school boards have compromised their ethics and values by allowing these machines in schools. And plastic bottles filled with water have become their own source of pollution. The reality is that we are all accomplices and enablers. (Charitably speaking, it's also about a lack of sufficient funding.)

#### So, extending some of these heretical thoughts to you I'll add alternatives:

1. We need to offer school children the best, not the cheapest food. In the long term, we'll cut down the hospital, insurance and societal costs that affect all of us.

2. We need to make sure our farmers and supermarkets are not solely geared to the wealthiest among us. Good quality, affordably-priced, nurturing and healthy foods should be available to all the public. Your local farmers' market should be reaching out to minorities and ethnic populations.

**3.** Plastics (particularly bags), have become a primary pollution source. They should be eliminated from our market place — the United Kingdom, France and countries like Rwanda recognize this and have started to ban their use. Whenever we have an opportunity, we should advocate their elimination — by voicing our concerns to elected officials, supermarket managers, farmers, etc. and by bringing our own bags.

4. Become more aware of what we eat. I subscribe to Nutrition Action. One of my farmworkers gets Life Extension. I believe we have evolved to eat a relatively modest diet based on famine, flight and fight, and a very active life. Sugar and transfat were not part of that diet. 1200 to 1500 calories were consumed in a whole day! Today, we might eat that in one meal — and then sit and watch TV or work at a computer most of the day. It's no accident that so many cancers (particularly breast and prostate) are located in fatty tissues. Or that type 2 diabetes is seemingly out of control. That all has to change if we're truly interested in the

### Small Township Fights Big Coal: Hopes to Go To Supreme Court

Residents fight against corporate privileges that "legalize" the coal corporations' destruction of their community.

Part I: Background

and empowering local communities to protect the land and water where they live so those places will support their children and grandchildren in the future. Not a pain-free plan but one that looks far beyond the next quarterly report.

What do you do when you recognize the threats, abandon the myths and see the power boundaries and relationships? Resign yourself to impotence? Or organize your resistance?

Blaine Township is resisting, along with a handful of other municipalities across the state. Blaine is a tiny community about 600 people living on 12 square miles in Washington County, which has a long, brave history of fighting oppression and a long, dirty history with King Coal. Starting in the early 1980s, coal mining - already plenty destructive thanks to acid mine drainage - got worse when longwall technologies replaced "room and pillar" mining. Longwall mining introduced huge machines that devour panels of coal up to six feet thick, 1,000 feet wide and 10,000 feet long, leaving no support for the ground above causing subsidence, damaging homes and roads, farms, waterways, ecosystems and livelihoods throughout southwestern Pennsylvania. The people of Blaine saw the longwall machines headed toward their homes, aquifers and streams. They saw the DEP stamp "approved" all over the permit applications in neighboring communities. And then they saw those communities ruined and abandoned, farms failed for lack of water, streams dried up, homes were badly damaged when the foundations collapsed beneath them and roadbeds cracked. In October 2005, Blaine Township residents began studying their options. What could they do to protect themselves? A year later, the Board of Supervisors adopted a Corporate Mining Ordinance banning corporations from mining within Blaine Township, and a Corporate Rights Ordinance stripping corporations operating in Blaine Township of legal rights intended for people but harmful to people and communities when exercised by corporate entities. A couple years later, they added a Corporate Disclosure Ordinance, barring corporations that have violated laws from doing business in Blaine. Two months ago, King Coal struck back, filing a 15-count complaint in U.S. District Court

and demanding that the Blaine supervisors back off. Claiming that Allegheny Pittsburgh Coal Co. owns 10 million recoverable tons of coal within Blaine's borders (part of about 56 million recoverable tons in the Buffalo Reserve) and that Penn Ridge Coal, LLC has leased mining rights, the lawyers wrote that the three Ordinances violated the mining corporations' constitutional rights and should be overturned.

In late November, Blaine Township lobbed a Motion to Dismiss, insisting that, under local law, the corporations lack constitutional rights and thus have no claim to judicial protection. The main argument asserted by Blaine Township is that the people of Blaine have a right to local self-government and that the granting of constitutional rights to corporations violates that right.

#### Blaine Township versus King Coal December 2008

What does it take for ordinary people to start a revolution?

For our ancestors, it meant letting go of a comforting myth: that King and Parliament enacted policies with the best interests of the colonists in mind, that the interests of colonists and rulers were identical.

When the colonists lost that illusion, they had to make a choice: resign themselves to subservience or resist. Their resistance made history. But realizing — in practice — the ideal of selfgovernance that most of the American Revolutionaries fought for, has proven elusive at best.

Another revolution is brewing.

One comforting myth nowadays is that the first priority of the Pennsylvania Legislature and the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is protecting citizens. It's scary to realize they work against the people who vote and pay their salaries but their real first priority is profit maximization for corporate donors who fund campaigns and write legislation. State laws — from agribusiness, sludge application and timbering to mining and water withdrawal hogtie people from taking direct action to protect their communities. The DEP just processes paperwork, "permitting" the harms corporate shareholders want to inflict.

Another myth is that economic development, resource extraction, consumption and profit can grow infinitely. Most resources are finite: destructible, nonrenewable, especially fossil fuels. And a growing global consensus plans to cut  $CO_2$  (carbon dioxide) emissions down from the current 387 parts per million (ppm) to 350 ppm. That means leaving the coal in the ground, speeding up the transition to conservation and clean energy In their motion, the Supervisors wrote: "If community selfgovernment is denied, the entire right to self-government is denied. One cannot have a 'right to ride a horse' if no horse is ever allowed under the rider."

King Coal, his lawyers, corporate directors and shareholders didn't like being knocked down off their throne by the regular folks in Blaine. They fired back by claiming that the U.S. Constitution, more than 100 years of Supreme Court law, Pennsylvania mining laws and the Pennsylvania Second Class Township Code render the people of Blaine "simply powerless" to prevent the destruction of their community by longwall coal mining since the Code "created" the Township and is the source from which "it exclusively derives any authority or even right to exist."

King Coal's attorneys wrote: "Plaintiffs do not dispute that the right of self-government is one of the cornerstones of the American system of government. Plaintiffs, however, dispute that the right of self-government rests in the hands of a Pennsylvania second class township."

Riders, but no horse.

King Coal then urged the District Court to "force the Township to address its concerns regarding mining within the system of laws created by the Pennsylvania legislature."

They want the judge to force the people of Blaine — who won't go willingly — back into the failed regulatory system at the DEP, through the preemptive laws that have permitted coal corporations to damage and destroy communities across the Photo by Shannon Biggs

state for generations, with legislative blessing and a limited liability cherry on top.

The lawsuit is expected to go to the U.S. Supreme Court via the Third Circuit Court of Appeals, on the issue of whether corporate constitutional rights are legitimate and whether self-governance is a real right or a myth.

#### Part II: Update

#### Compiled from CELDF Literature

There are two lawsuits against Blaine Township currently. First, by two coal corporations against the Corporate Mining Ordinance and the Corporate "Rights" and Community Self-Government Ordinance.

The second lawsuit, filed against Blaine by Range Resources (gas extraction corporation) attempts to challenge the municipalities Corporate Disclosure Ordinance. Both are currently active cases. Our legal briefs in support of the Ordinances (CELDF is Blaine's legal representative in the suits) are available for you to review at CELDF.org.

The people of Blain Township have "gone further than any of the 120 U.S. municipalities that have passed ordinances to curb corporate activity such as factory farming or spreading sewage sludge," said CELDF lawyer Tom Linzey in a June 15<sup>th</sup> Reuters article.

Linzey, the article continues, "predicted the case will eventually go to the U.S. Supreme Court because it pits energy companies who want to exploit one of America's richest coal seams against residents who are determined to resist what they see as rapacious mining."

Although the Supreme Court is unlikely to overturn more than 100 years of law giving corporations personhood, Linzey expects the outcome of any decision to "become a spring-board for a popular campaign for a constitutional amendment to strip corporations of those rights." (Reuters)

Here are some highlights from the Memorandum of Law and History in Support of Blaine Township's Motion to Dismiss the Penn Ridge lawsuit, filed on November 26, 2008: tributing to floods, by polluting the water, by destroying fish and wildlife habitats, by impairing natural beauty, by damaging the property of citizens, by creating hazards dangerous to life and property, by degrading the quality of life in local communities and by counteracting governmental programs and efforts to conserve soil, water and other natural resources. (Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act)

• Back in 1966, the Pennsylvania legislature made a bolder statement in the Bituminous Mine Subsidence and Land Conservation Act: Damage from mine subsidence had "caused a very clear and present danger to the health, safety and welfare of the people of Pennsylvania."

• Pennsylvania has one-third of all abandoned mine-related environmental problems in the entire country and more than 2,500 miles of its streams are degraded by acid mine drainage pollution.

• Physical, chemical and biological changes in streams have been documented as direct consequences of longwall mining.

• Changes to streambeds have also been documented to reduce aquatic habitat by 50% and decrease the number of species within those streams.

• The State ranks first in the nation in the total estimated cost of environmental cleanup need-ed for the past mining of coal — over \$15 billion.

Add THAT to the cost of "cheap energy," namely coal.

People realize their fundamental right to decide the future of their community is subordinated to a dirty energy policy they didn't create, didn't approve and which they are told is for the "private" sector (corporate directors) to decide, against the consent of the governed.

Arthur, Texas for incineration. This raises environmental justice issues. There are other systems that do not produce a hazardous waste stream, such as the Donovan Blast Chamber, but the Army Corps does not plan to use that system.

#### Is this safe?

As a precaution, in 1993, during the first Spring Valley cleanup, Operation Safe Removal, then-vice-president Dan Ouavle was evacuated from his home at the U.S. Observatory, Naval approximately one mile south of Spring Valley.

At the Army Corps' March community meeting, several residents were so concerned about the health and safety of the residents and the District's drinking water supply that they asked that the munitions destruction be moved to a military base. Munitions have been safely destroyed at the Naval Research Lab, a hazardous waste facility in Washington, D.C., near Bolling Air Force Base and the Blue Plains sewage treatment plant, also in D.C.

The Army Corps said it was too dangerous to transport the munitions but that statement is disingenuous, as munitions have been safely transported on several occasions in the past.

In 1993, 43 munitions recovered from the 52nd Court Pit in Spring Valley were safely transported to Pine Bluff Arsenal in Arkansas and were destroyed. In 2002 three arsinefilled rounds recovered from Pit 3 were safely transported to the Battelle Institute, a hazardous waste facility in Ohio, and were destroyed.

and the Glenbrook Road Burial Pit, through Spring Valley, to the Interim Holding Facility on the Federal property behind Sibley Hospital.

#### What Chemical Warfare Agents Are We Dealing With?

The contents of some of the recovered munitions were misidentified. Most of the munitions destroyed in 2003 contained mustard agent. According to Dr. Paul Chrostowski, a public health consultant hired by American University, mustard agent is mutagenic. Mustard agent damages the chromosomes - damage that can be passed down from one generation to the next. Children and teenagers are more susceptible to eye injuries from mustard agent exposure than adults.

At least one of the recovered rounds contains high explosives, according to a posting on a UXO Web site (unexploded ordnance) by someone familiar with the project, but the Army Corps denied this.

At least one of the recently recovered munitions is an explosivelyconfigured, arsine-filled 75 mm round. Arsine is the most toxic chemical warfare agent found to date in Spring Valley. There is no antidote for arsine exposure. Arsine exposure is associated with brain tumors. Several Spring Valley residents have reported brain tumors.

Explosively-configured, arsine-filled rounds have never been destroyed in a residential neighborhood. Perhaps there is a good reason.

Unfortunately, District residents don't have anyone looking out for their public health and safety, as no one from the Department of Health attends the Partnering, Restoration Advisory Board or com-

If there is an accidental detonation during this period, the vapor containment structure could be destroyed and a chemical warfare agent could be released into the area.

When the Army Corps' contractors were removing the munitions from the Glenbrook Road Burial Pit on American University's property, they took several precautions.

They used a blast containment structure in case of an accidental detonation. They posted large signs at the edge of the 742-foot safety zone so that everyone entering the area was aware of what to do in case of an emergency. They also had a warning siren which was the signal for residents to "shelter in place" in the event of an accidental release. They instructed residents who lived inside the safety zone what to do in the event of an accidental release.

The Army Corps does not plan to use any of these safety measures during this munitions destruction.

In addition, some of the chemicals used in the EDS to neutralize the chemical warfare agents are just as toxic as the chemical warfare agents.

More than a dozen residents live within 500 feet of the proposed chemical munitions destruction. Less than 1,000 feet away is the District's drinking water supply and Sibley Hospital. The Army Corps said they canvassed approximately 40 households but more than 13,000 people live in Spring Valley.

Instead of destroying the munitions next to the District's water supply, Sibley Hospital and Spring Valley residents, doesn't it make more sense to destroy

the munitions on a military base such as the Naval Research Lab? Furthermore, it might also be better to use the Donovan Blast Chamber instead of the Explosives Destruction System.

writing of this article 54,403 horses have been slaughtered this year.

There are currently no horse slaughterhouses in the United States so horses are trucked long distances to slaughter in Mexico and Canada. Undercover investigations in Mexico demonstrate that horses are killed there by being stabbed in the back with knives; this paralyzes the horses but they are fully conscious during this ordeal.

#### What Can You Do?

Currently, there are three bills pending in Congress that aim to protect horses and other equines from the inhumane transport to slaughter and from slaughter itself:

Horse Transportation Safety Act of 2009 (H.R. 305)

prohibits the use of double-decker trucks to transport equines.

Horse Prevention of Cruelty Act (H.R. 503) and the Senate Prevention of Cruelty Act (S. 727) - both prohibit the slaughter of horses for human consumption and the domestic and international transport of live horses or horseflesh for human consumption.

Finally, Congress should repeal Amendment 142 (offered by former Senator Conrad Burns) of the Omnibus Appropriations Bill which authorized the BLM and the U.S. Forest Service to sell "without restriction" wild horses and burros removed from public lands who are over 10 years of age or who have been offered unsuccessfully for adoption three times.

Crime has gone down in the neighborhoods with community gardens, according to police reports.

encouraged to go outside and walk to their garden, they are removing fears that have existed for generations. share of the crop. The RCGA has a nochemical policy for its gardeners. Compost is the preferred choice of getting nutrients back into the soil. We have an organic soil specialist who is making compost systems at each garden. There is no waste. The old and unwanted plants go into the compost pile and come out as fresh, wanted plant food. Most of the gardeners use permaculture principles while growing and there is always some to share.

At the end of the season, the RCGA hosts a Harvest Festival. This festival was started in order to treat the community to a free meal of fresh local foods, prepared by the city's finest chefs.

There's more to eating than going to the store and throwing food into your stomach. When you are part of a community-based food system, everybody eats. There's home-grown, local markets, short-haul distribution, regional processing, small farms and slow foods, all right here.
